ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Dane Harrold, Principal grades 3-6, updated the Board of Directors on several items taking place at the Intermediate School this year.

A newly implemented school wide positive behavior program, called Panther Paws. Panther Paws were distributed to teachers and staff at the Intermediate School. Teachers give these paws out to students that go above and beyond what is expected of them during the normal school day. This program is about doing the right thing all the time. At the end of each month, there are rewards for the students. Thirty-nine students at the end of September received the reward of an ice cream sundae party.

With the help of *Mr. Kyle Brown*, guidance counselor we are implementing Character Program again this year. Each marking period we have a short assembly where we talk about character traits. The four character traits that we are focusing on this year are respect, compassion, perseverance, and patience. At the end of the year, homeroom teachers nominate three students that displayed the four character traits from each homeroom and those students are given a certificate and a pizza party at the end of the year.

If you have visited the school buildings in the district, you have probably seen our Panther Pledge Against Bullying banners that are displayed in each of the buildings. This pledge is also posted throughout the school. Students are reminded everyday not to bully others, to stick up for those being bullied, to include others who are being left out, and most important to report bullying. Bullying isn't something that is new, it is something that we have always taken very serious as administrators. This year we have really promoted sticking up for others, reporting bullying, and we are seeing more of that this year.
