- VI. A Proposed Final Budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, be adopted and advertised and be available for public review at least twenty (20) days prior to final adoption. Set the millage rate at 55.14 mills of property in Cambria County. School District Property in Blair County will be taxed at 6.04 mills. These mill rates are in compliance with Section 24 of the Public School Code 6-672.1 (re-balancing). These millage rates reflect no tax increase from the 2018-2019 fiscal year.
