<p><u>Natural Resources Hunt:</u></p> <p>Go outside and find 3 natural resources. Can you name different ways we use these natural resources? Can you name 2 things that are made from natural resources?</p>	<p><u>Multiplication:</u></p> <p>Go to http://www.sheppardsoftware.com/ and click on <u>math games</u> then click on <u>Fruit Splat Multiplication</u> to practice multiplication facts or write your facts outside with sidewalk chalk or on paper using different colored crayons.</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Choose an animal from one of the groups we learned. Using a shoebox and items from around your house create their habitat (Remember the groups - Amphibians, Reptiles, Fish, Birds, and Mammals)</p>
<p><u>Social Studies:</u></p> <p>Draw a map of your community and label important places like: businesses, parks, monuments, streets, shops, fire stations, police stations, schools.</p>	<p><u>National Geographic Kids:</u></p> <p>Go to https://kids.nationalgeographic.com/ go to videos and watch <u>Best Jobs Ever</u> draw/write about a job would want to do when you grow up.</p>	<p><u>Nature Walk:</u></p> <p>Go outside and look for 3 things that are living and 3 things that are non-living.</p>
<p><u>Math Games:</u></p> <p>Make the KABOOM! Multiplication Game. Rules of the game: 1. Pull a stick 2. Answer the multiplication fact correctly that is on your stick 3. Keep your stick OR if you miss it...return the stick to the cup 4. Keep taking turns until someone draws a KABOOM stick! 5. Then that player's sticks go back in the cup 6. Winner is the player with the most sticks at the end of playing time. Have fun! First you will need to make a list of as many compound words as you can. Then make Compound Eggs! If you do not have plastic eggs available, you can write them down on paper! Option 1: Egg Activity- Write each small word on separate sides of the egg. Then put all pieces into a basket or bag and start pairing, finding the compound words! Option 2: Paper activity- Write each small word on its own piece of paper and then lay all words out on a flat surface. Begin matching the words correctly making a compound word!
