Due Date: All responses are due in their entirety on the first day of the school year. They will be turned in to me in A145. This assignment is mandatory to be in Honors English 10.

*** Be prepared to complete a Power point/ project the first week worth 100 points that will serve as an in-class review of both novels. This project will cover characters and their traits, setting and its role, theme, symbolism, plot, literary devices and internal/external conflict.

Prompts

- Good vs. evil is a prevalent theme in both novels. Explain how this concept is shown.
 Use characters and specific situations to explain your answer. Be specific; and use both novels to explain your answer.
- 2. "The measure of a man is what he does with power." Plato

The idea of power engulfs each novel. Analyze what Curly and Jack "do" with their power. Use specific details and situations to defend your answer. Use text support.

- 3. Compare the characters of Ralph from *Lord of the Flies* and George from *Of Mice and Men*. Are their beliefs similar? Are their fates similar? What do they value most and why? Use specific details and situations from the works to explain your answer. Use text evidence to support your answer.
- 4. Examine the meaning of the titles, Lord of the Flies and Of Mice and Men. Compare or contrast the meanings of these two titles. Use text evidence to support your answer.
