Review letters

Crayons, markers, use your finger in shaving cream or get out that rice if you saved it from before, write in the air, anyway you want!!! But practice writing letters. You do not need to do them all at once, whenever you have time, or need and activity write!!!!

Language and Literacy Activities

1. Using toothpicks, popsicle sticks, pieces of dry spaghetti, crayons, markers....anything straight, like last week. But this week you will also need something that bends, yarn, ribbon, pipe cleaners, string, etc.. Construct these letters: B, C, D, G, J, O, P, Q, R, S, U. Things to discuss: How many straight pieces did it take to make that letter? Do they all need the same number of pieces? How many curves does it have?
2. In the car, at bath time, during a walk, anytime you have time to talk.... Start with A make the sound and try to come up with a word that starts with it. Either both or you, or take turns, you do A, let them do B, if there are siblings see if they can join in and do C. Sounds silly and simple, but these simple connections really help children internalize their letters and sounds.



MATH ACTIVITIES:

1. Just like the ABC activity we did last week...use toothpicks, popsicle sticks, pieces of dry spaghetti, crayons, markers....anything straight.....construct shapes. Ask how many pieces did we need? Yes...a triangle has 3 sides so we need 3 crayons to make it.
2. Look around the house, outside, in books and see what shapes you can find. A clock is a circle, a book is a rectangle, a plate is a circle....etc... Attach these shape words to everyday objects 😊




This is a full episode! Cookie Monster thinks the moon is a cookie!
