How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

Penn Cambria School District will continue to take steps to both prevent and mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on staff and students. The district leadership team remains committed to monitoring of information and recommendations from the PA Department of Education (PDE), the PA Department of Health (DOH), and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

A layered system of mitigation strategies will be used to help prevent COVID spread in schools. Strategies will include the following:

- Communication of COVID-19 symptoms and protocols for responding when symptoms are present
- Self-screening for COVID-19 symptoms
- Continued emphasis on hand-washing and cough etiquette
- Continued use of standard cleaning and disinfecting protocols
- Continued emphasis on improved ventilation

Mitigation protocols are subject to change based on orders or requirements from PDE, DOH and/or the CDC.

How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.

Penn Cambria School District will offer the following planned academic options for students in the 2023-2024 school year.

1) Full in-person instruction

- a. <u>Academic Support</u> is provided by classroom teachers, Title 1 teachers, special education teachers, paraeducators, after-school programs and summer school.
- b. <u>Social Emotional Support</u> is provided through school counselors, on-site mental health therapy services, school psychologist, school social worker, SAP teams, implementation of K-8 Second Step SEL curriculum, and implementation of Trauma-Skilled Schools Model strategies.
- c. <u>Health Support</u> is provided through continued support from school nursing staff located in each building.
- d. <u>Food Service Support</u> is provided through the breakfast and lunch meal program in each building.

2) Fully online learning through the PC Cyber Academy

- a. <u>Academic Support</u> is provided by course teachers and PC Cyber Mentors. Additional academic support is available through Penn Cambria's on-site after school tutoring opportunities.
- b. <u>Social Emotional Support</u> is provided through school counselors, remote mental health therapy services, school psychologist, school social worker, and referrals through SAP teams.
- c. <u>Health Support</u> is provided through continued remote support from school nursing
- **d.** <u>Food Service Support</u> will only be provided if authorization for remote meal bundles is provided from the National School Lunch Program.

Penn Cambria School District will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff by using the practices noted in the table below.

C.	Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	Frequent handwashing will continue to be encouraged with opportunities for handwashing provided throughout the day. Hand sanitizer will continue to be made available for staff and student use. Cough etiquette will continue to be promoted through signage, classroom mini-lessons and reminders from the school health offices. Tissues, trash receptacles, and hand sanitizer will be made easily accessible to encourage prompt and proper response to coughs, runny noses, and sneezes.
d.	Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;	A continued emphasis on daily cleaning protocols will continue. A per CDC guidance, cleaning daily is generally enough to sufficiently remove potential virus on surfaces, especially when combined with regular disinfecting. Disinfectant fogging will continue to be available. Attention to reasonable practices to improve ventilation both on buses and in buildings will continue based on CDC guidance. As feasible, classroom windows and bus windows may be opened to allow for increased ventilation. Air purifiers with HEPA filters have been installed and will remain i use in high risk/low-ventilation rooms.
e.	Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	Individuals who are identified as symptomatic while in the building will be evaluated by nursing staff and sent home as appropriate. Return to school protocols for symptomatic individuals will follow PDE/DOH guidance for responding to symptomatic individuals. All persons with confirmed cases of COVID-19 will be required to isolate according to guidance from DOH.

f.	Diagnostic and screening testing;	Information about local providers offering free or low-cost diagnostic testing will be shared on an as-needed basis for symptomatic individuals.
		Free test kits will be offered to families if there is a state/federal program to provide them.
g.	Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;	Information about local vaccination opportunities will continue to be shared with families and staff upon request.
h.	Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	The Director of Special Education, special education teachers, school nurses and school counselors will work with families to develop specific accommodations related to health and safety policies in accordance with any mandates for DOH or CDC.
i.	Coordination with state and local health officials.	The district will continue to collaborate with Cambria County Emergency Management and local community health agencies and providers to improve emergency health response.
